Everyone is welcome to attend and participate in these meetings - no charge, no need to reserve.

- April 02:** Mr. Jean-Jacques Surbeck will discuss “**The birth and development of the Red Cross and International Humanitarian Law, from its beginnings to today’s many conflicts**”. Mr. Surbeck earned his Law Degree from the University of Geneva, Switzerland, with a specialization in International Humanitarian Law. That led him to a 16-year career with the International Committee of the Red Cross.
- April 09:** Mr. Kenn Coil and Mr. Robert Gailey will present “**Lazarian World Homes: Building cost-effective, eco-friendly, long-lasting, earthquake resistant, energy-efficient buildings in and for impoverished communities**”. This nonprofit organization partners with Point Loma Nazarene and Baylor Universities and the Armenian Relief and Development Agency to build housing in developing countries with limited natural and financial resources.
- April 16:** Ms. Alma Aguilar, Executive Director, San Diego World Affairs Council, will show us the film “**The Monster Among Us**”. “Few Americans know much about the resurgence of anti-Semitism in Europe today, but 60 years after the Holocaust, hatred has reared its ugly head in the guise of radical Muslim beliefs and actions.” The film personalizes this crisis through the experiences of people from all walks of life in six European countries.
- April 23:** Dr. Barry Naughton, the Sokwanlok Chair of Chinese International Affairs at UCSD’s IR/PS Graduate School, will discuss how “**China Faces the Global Economic Crisis**”. Dr. Naughton has published extensively on the Chinese economy with a focus on four areas: economic transition; industry and technology; foreign trade; and Chinese political economy. His most recent book “*The Chinese Economy: Transitions and Growth*” was published in 2007.
- April 30:** Dr. Abdul Sattar Sirat will review the general ideological movements current in the Islamic world in a talk entitled: “**Contemporary Islamic Movements**”. Some of these are relatively new and some have been with us for many years. All have a purpose and a potential for significant cultural change. Two will be examined in detail: the Muslim Brotherhood based in Egypt and the religious movement founded by Mohammad Abdul Wahhab in Saudi Arabia in the 18th century.
